New Laws Promote Construction of ADUs

ADU or Accessory Dwelling Unit (also referred to as a “second unit” or “granny unit”) is an attached or detached residential dwelling unit situated on the same parcel as an existing primary single-family dwelling. This unit provides complete independent living facilities for one or more persons, including permanent provisions for living, sleeping, eating, cooking, and sanitation.

Recent state legislation eases various legal provisions to promote the development of ADUs, including allowing ADUs to be built concurrently with a single-family home, and reducing parking requirements.

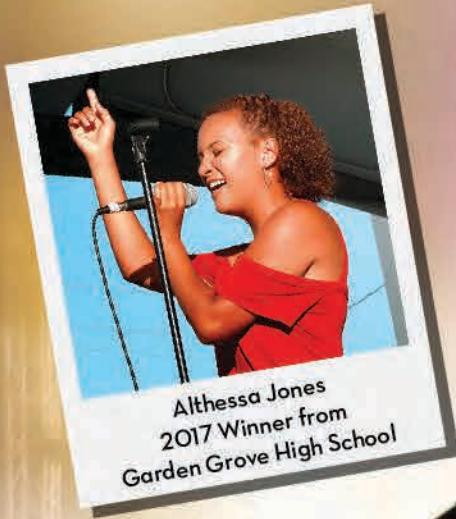

SWIM CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

PARENT & CHILD (\$50)

Ages: 6 months-4 years

Parents and children participate in guided practice with emphasis on fun, comfort, and swimming readiness. This course does not teach children to be accomplished swimmers nor to survive in the water. Swim diapers are required. One adult, 18 years of age or older, must accompany the child in the water.

PRE-STAR (\$50)

Ages: 2-3 years

This 20 minute class introduces children to the pool in a class environment. Emphasis is on cooperation with the instructor and learning basic motor skills in the water, which guides and prepares them for the Starfish class. Swim diapers are required.

STARFISH (\$50)

Ages: 3-5 years

This class is for new swimmers younger than six years of age. Introduces swimming and water safety to children with little or no previous swimming experience who are comfortable in the water without parental assistance or floatation devices. Swim diapers are recommended.

TADPOLE (\$50)

Ages: 4-5 years

For children younger than six years of age who can independently float on front and back with minimal support, and swim 9 feet unassisted.

SEA TURTLE (\$50)

Ages: 4-5 years

For children younger than six years of age who have passed Tadpole. Child can start from the wall and swim 15 feet of front crawl, and do an independent back glide.

GUPPY (\$50)

Ages: 6 years and up (Not younger than six)

Introduction to water safety for children with limited to no swimming experience. Helps children build confidence, swim on front and back short distances by themselves, and develop safety skills in and around the water.

SEAL (\$50)

Ages: 6 years and up or for children who have passed the Guppy or Sea Turtle level

This class is for children who can swim more than 15 feet by themselves. New skills include learning a combined stroke on front and back, tread water, and water safety skills.

DOLPHIN (\$50)

Ages: 6 years and up or for children who have passed the Seal level

Designed for children who can swim both front and back strokes at least 30 feet, jump into deep water and tread water. New skills include the development of coordinated strokes, diving, and more safety skills.

PRIVATE LESSONS

Individual instruction for all ages is available in a series of four (4) lessons, 40 minutes in length. Private for one is \$85. Semi-private for two is \$110.

Save Your Community's Citrus

A Deadly Plant Disease and Dangerous Pest Have Been Found in California

The California citrus we all know and love is at risk. A devastating plant disease called Huanglongbing, also known as HLB or citrus greening, has been found in Southern California. HLB kills citrus trees and there is no cure. Diseased trees produce bitter, hard and lopsided fruit, and eventually die. The disease is spread by a pest called the Asian citrus psyllid as it feeds from tree to tree. Psyllids are small, about the size of an aphid, and can be seen on the small, tender, new leaves of citrus trees. The best way to protect California citrus from the disease is to stop the spread of the pest.

We All Play a Critical Role:

- Inspect your citrus trees monthly for the pest and disease.
- Do not move citrus plants, leaves or foliage in or out of your community, or across state or international borders.
- Cooperate with agriculture crews placing traps, inspecting trees and treating for the pest.
- Talk to your local nursery or garden center about products that can protect your tree from the Asian citrus psyllid.
- Plant citrus trees from reputable, licensed nurseries in your area.
- When grafting trees, only buy registered budwood with source documentation.
- Control ants on your citrus trees. Ants interfere with beneficial insects and actually protect the Asian citrus psyllid. Talk to your local nursery about ant bait that can help.
- If you no longer wish to care for your citrus tree, consider removing it so it does not become a host to the pest and disease.
- If you suspect your tree has the psyllid or disease, act fast! Call the California Department of Food and Agriculture at **800-491-1899**.

Personal Safety

When it comes to personal safety while out in the community, some people might not realize how distracted they can get while doing the ordinary things in their routine. It is important for us to be present and alert to the things that are going on around us. That means we shouldn't have our heads down while we are on our phones and walking at the same time. We should also be able to hear what is going on around us, so if we have ear buds in, we should only put one side in.

If you like to get out to the parks for fun and family time, or if you like to use them for walking, jogging, or exercising, being aware of your surroundings will make you less of a target for victimization.

If your opportunity for walking, jogging or running in the park is when it is dark, do so with a buddy. Criminals like to get to a person when they are alone and not paying sufficient attention to their surroundings. If they see somebody proactively aware of their surroundings, as well as potentially the type to cause trouble, possibilities are they will leave you alone.

Maintaining Your Youngsters Safety

Any parent, or those who have children in their lives, know how quickly they can run off while you are shopping, at the park, or anywhere for that matter. Remember to maintain a watchful eye on them as well as ensure they are close by at all times. We cannot always know where our kids are, especially teens, but try and establish specific guidelines for safety with them.

It never hurts to be prepared for anything. Make sure you have your phone with you in case of an emergency. Take a self-defense class, they're fun. Be aware of your surroundings.

FIREWORKS

To prevent property loss and ensure the safety of your family, your home and your business, the City of Stanton has scheduled additional law enforcement and fire protection personnel for the night of July 4th. Please enjoy the holiday but observe the following safety rules:

- No block parties on city streets, sidewalks or public right-of-ways.
- City parks will close at 7:30 p.m.
- Fireworks may only be discharged on private residential property.
- Do not discharge fireworks on any public right-of-way, city street, sidewalk, city park or private commercial or industrial property. This includes all city streets located in or near:

- Stanton Park Condominiums
- Bradford Place Condominiums
- Summertree Condominiums
- Smoketree Condominiums
- Harry M. Dotson Park
- Hollenbeck Park
- Zuniga Park
- Stanton Park
- Premier Park
- Stanton Central Park

- No person under the age of 18 years old shall purchase ANY fireworks, including safe and sane.
- No person under the age of 18 years old shall discharge any fireworks, including safe and sane fireworks, except when under the direct supervision and in the presence of an adult.
- Any person found in violation of these provisions may be issued an administrative citation by an enforcement officer and subject to a \$1,000 fine for each violation or a misdemeanor citation punishable by six months in jail or \$1,000 fine.

If you observe a discharge of illegal fireworks or any safe and sane fireworks discharged under hazardous conditions, call the Orange County Sheriff's Department at (714) 647-7000 immediately!

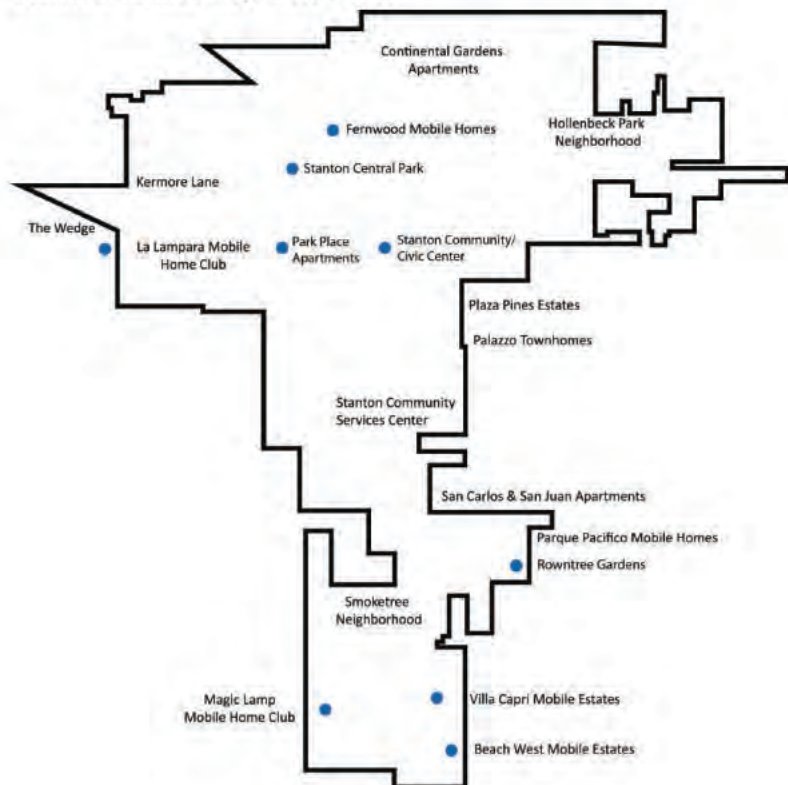
NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING

Stanton community-based organizations such as **CITY NET, THE ILLUMINATION FOUNDATION** and the **BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF STANTON** received a total of **\$224,000**

S.W.A.G.G.

A public safety task force made up of the cities of **STANTON, WESTMINSTER** and **GARDEN GROVE**



Established in **2017** after the City Managers of each City agreed to dedicate resources to improve the **BEACH BOULEVARD** and **GARDEN GROVE BOULEVARD** area

Composed of units in each city including the **STANTON POLICE SERVICES,** the **WESTMINSTER POLICE DEPARTMENT** and the **GARDEN GROVE POLICE DEPARTMENT**

The task force currently handles issues such as **HOMELESSNESS, PROSTITUTION AND DRUGS**

To date, S.W.A.G.G. has completed **TWO OPERATIONS** that have resulted in **50+ ARRESTS**

BEACH BOULEVARD COALITION

Established in **2015** to discuss common themes and issues observed on the Beach Boulevard corridor between the Cities of **ANAHEIM, BUENAPARK** and **STANTON**

Originally formed at the request of **MAYOR TAIT** from Anaheim

The **MAYOR, CITY MANAGER** and **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR** from each City are members of the coalition



Morphed into a discussion on how to **REVITALIZE** the Beach Boulevard corridor and became a larger group including an invitation to all cities along Beach Boulevard

The primary focuses have been on **BRANDING THE CORRIDOR** and **IDENTIFYING UNIFORM SIGNAGE OPPORTUNITIES** to create a **SENSE OF PLACE** for Beach Boulevard

ANIMAL CONTROL SERVICES

THE CITY OF STANTON previously worked with the **COUNTY OF ORANGE** to provide animal control services

After a new county shelter was announced, **STANTON CITY COUNCIL** looked for alternatives to reduce costs

The City of Stanton eventually partnered with the **CITY OF WESTMINSTER** to provide services for Stanton residents, thus saving the City nearly **\$80,000** per year

The **WESTMINSTER POLICE DEPARTMENT** handles field services while **WAGS PET ADOPTION** is responsible for shelter and adoption services



This partnership has resulted in **REDUCED COSTS** and an **INCREASED LEVEL OF SERVICE** for City of Stanton residents

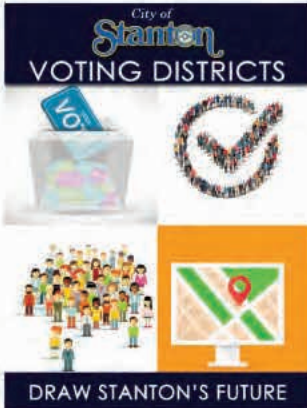

Stanton District Elections November 2018

Attention Stanton Voters - Your Vote Matters

Thanks to your involvement with drawing the future of Stanton, the City of Stanton now has four new voting districts and an at-large Mayor. These new districts replace the previous at-large voting system, which means that starting with the November 6, 2018, General Municipal Election:



- ★ Two Council Member seats will be up for election and shall be elected "By-District" (District 1 and District 3) along with the at-large Mayor.
- ★ Only residents that live in those respective districts up for election can cast ballots for their candidate of choice.
- ★ The election of Mayor will remain "at-large" meaning elected by all the voters of the city, no matter where in the city you live.
- ★ The Orange County Registrar of Voters has obtained data from the City of Stanton to integrate into its precinct system to determine which voters are in which districts (based on the City Council approved map) and who will need a ballot.

This will be the first opportunity for Stanton voters to vote for candidates based on the City's new by-district voting system. The City wants all registered voters in District 1 and District 3 to be aware and prepared for the November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election in our City. City staff will continue to monitor illegal businesses throughout the city and take the appropriate action. To date, there are zero dispensaries in the city.

Home Security Tips

How secure is your home? If you are locked out of your home, can you still get in? Possibly through an unlocked window or by using a hidden key under a flowerpot? If you can break into your home, so can a burglar! A small investment of time and money can make your home more secure.



Always lock your windows and doors when you go out, even if for only a few minutes. Keep the landscaping around your home trimmed down around doorways, windows and light fixtures. Update and repair broken locks and lights. Install or update your security alarm system. Just a few simple steps can help reduce your chances of becoming a victim of this costly crime.

After you have installed all the proper locks on your doors and windows, remember to use them! Did you know in almost fifty percent of all residential burglaries, thieves enter through an unlocked door or window? This means that you can significantly reduce your chances of becoming a victim by simply locking your doors and windows. While this will not prevent all burglaries from occurring, this will certainly deter the opportunistic burglar from making your home their next target.

- 1) Look and listen for traffic.

WATER SAFETY BARRIERS



No single barrier provides 100% protection. Multiple barriers must be in place so that if one fails, there is another to slow or prevent a child from reaching the water alone and unsupervised. The more barriers you install and maintain, the safer your family will be.

Identify your risk and have numerous barriers in place to keep children from all water sources.

Non-Climbable Fence

- Install a 4-sided isolation fence tall enough to prevent children from climbing over (at least 4-5 feet)
- Chain-link or other climbable fences don't provide adequate protection
- Bottom of fence must be close enough to the ground to prevent a child from crawling under
- Remove patio furniture or other items a child might use to climb over a fence

Self-Closing/Latching Gate

- Install a self-closing, self-latching gate with a locking mechanism a child can't reach
- Gate should open outward away from the pool

Pool/Spa Covers

- Pool and spa covers protect children and pets by acting as horizontal fences

Door/Window/Pool Alarms

- Alarms will sound whenever triggered

Child and Pet Alarms

- Child wristbands and pet collars trigger the base alarm as soon as they get wet
- Portable and can be used at any pool

Indoor Barriers

- Child-safety doorknob handle covers
- Toilet latches
- Baby gates

Barriers buy time! But, they only offer protection if they work properly. Inspect barriers for damage regularly and repair immediately if needed.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Development Update

2018 has been a year of significant development activity for the City of Stanton. Just like last year, the City is continuing to receive new applications for development, however this year we are finally starting to see these projects take shape. A number of new exciting developments which include restaurants, offices, housing and other developments are set to open their doors to the community. Here is a snapshot of new developments recently completed or set to be completed in the months to come:

12456 Beach Boulevard

This is a newly constructed 11,000 square foot medical office building just north of the CVS Pharmacy which includes a dialysis center. The applicant is currently obtaining a State license for the dialysis center and anticipates occupying the building in 2019.



12950 Beach Boulevard

At the northeast corner of Beach and Garden Grove Boulevard, a new 4,000 square foot retail center was constructed. The tenants include Sprint Wireless and Starbucks with a drive thru lane, both of which opened in late March. Welcome to Stanton!



11382-11437 Beach Boulevard

This site has a new commercial retail center which includes restaurants, Hiccups and Churroholic, a Wendy's fast food restaurant and a service station with a drive-through car wash and convenience market. Restaurants will be opening this summer followed shortly by the service station.



Residential Construction

Construction of residential units is underway across the city at the following locations: 7921 Second Street, 8101 & 8111 Catherine Avenue and 8232 Lampson Avenue.

BUILDING PERMITS

Whether replacing a window, or remodeling your kitchen, virtually every homeowner at some point wants to make changes to their home. A building permit is required for most construction projects. In addition to promoting quality construction and safety standards, the building permit process promotes projects that are attractive, fit well within a neighborhood and support good property values. The process to obtain a building permit follows several basic steps.



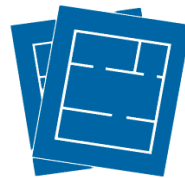
1. Draw a site plan

Don't forget to discuss your project with the Planning Division.



2. Call to confirm

that you need a building permit at (714) 890-4286.



3. Bring documents

Once Planning approves your documents, visit the Building Division from 7-8 a.m. and 1-5 p.m. Monday-Thursday.



4. Begin building

Once your plans are reviewed and marked code compliant, we'll issue a building permit.

We do our best to make the process quick and simple. Working without a building permit when one is required is illegal and can pose serious complications for your fire and homeowner's insurance when you try to sell your home.

RESIDENTIAL SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR REQUIREMENTS

The State of California requires that smoke and carbon monoxide detectors be properly installed in all single-family homes. As such, you are required to install smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors if you submit an application for an alteration, repair or addition.

California State Law requires an operating smoke detector in each room used for sleeping purposes.

California State Law requires operating smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in the following locations:

- In hallways outside of bedrooms.
- At the top of interior stairways.
- On each level if the dwelling has more than one level (including basements).

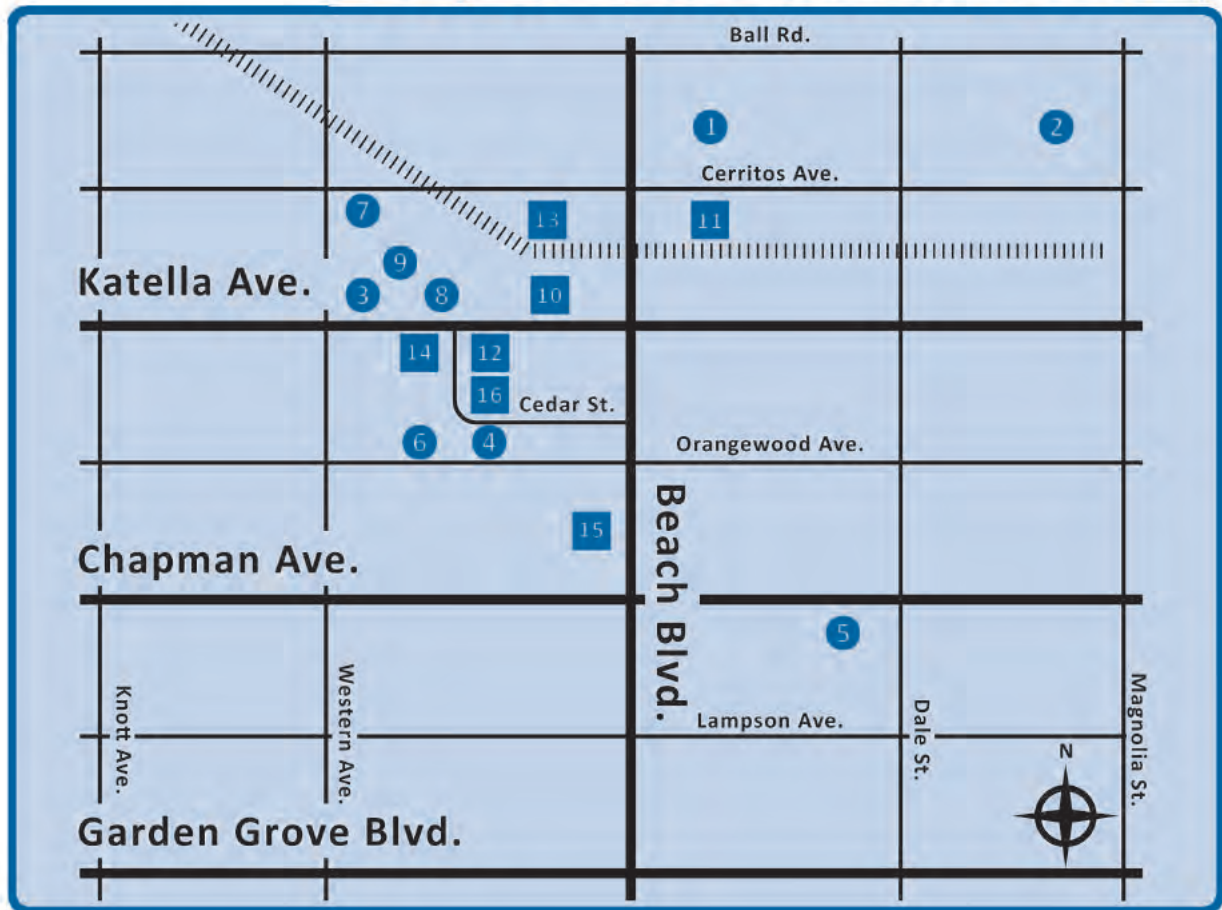

1. Water at the right times: Watering during the middle of the day is a waste; the water evaporates and plants don't get the necessary moisture. Make sure to water before 9:00 AM and after 5:00 PM.
2. Use a moisture meter: Moisture meters take the guess work out of watering. Insert a moisture meter in the soil and only water when the moisture meter registers dry. Call the Water Division at 714-548-3687 or visit your local home improvement store to get a moisture meter.
3. Remove turf or install drip irrigation: Orange County is still offering rebates for residents. Visit www.ocwatersmart.com for sprinkler, irrigation controller, and turf removal rebates.
4. Add mulch to your soil: Applying a 2-inch layer of mulch slows water evaporation, as well as suppressing weeds in planting beds.
5. Raise mower blades to leave grass a little longer: Longer grass promotes deeper root growth, resulting in a more drought-resistant lawn, reduced evaporation, and fewer weeds.

READY FOR AN EMERGENCY?

Get Prepared Today!

ReadyOC.org provides you with step-by-step advice on how to prepare for disasters. And, it provides you with real-time information on current county emergencies and how best to respond and recover during these situations. Everyone should have an emergency preparedness kit with water, food, prescribed medicine, comfortable shoes, and other essential items that can sustain them for at least 72 hours up to two weeks.

Are You Ready?

All of us in Orange County know how quickly disaster can strike, and how fast “too late” can be. Yet more than 7 out of 10 of us have not made any emergency preparations. From flooding and wildfires to landslides and earthquakes, our county continuously faces emergency situations. We know the next emergency is coming. We just don’t know when or what kind. What about you? Are you ready?

Let ReadyOC Help You

If a disaster occurs in your community, government and disaster relief organizations will try to help you. But all of us need to be ready as well. ReadyOC is an online-based emergency preparedness campaign that can help. Through ReadyOC.org, you have access to the tools and resources you need to better prepare for emergency situations. www.readyoc.org

AlertOC Emergency Notification System

AlertOC is a mass notification system used by the County of Orange and the City of Westminster to issue government related messages to residents and businesses. The system has the capacity to send thousands of messages, in various languages, within minutes via phone, e-mail and text. Only authorized officials are allowed access to the system. Log on to www.AlertOC.com, select choice of language, and register today.



Authorized officials record a voice, e-mail or text message that is then delivered quickly to individuals in the notification system. The primary use of the system will be to disseminate messages pertaining to the health, safety or welfare of a community that is being affected by a perceived, emerging, or imminent emergency event.

AlertOC contains residential and commercial landline phone numbers for most of Orange County’s geographic population. In accordance with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), landline numbers are acquired from AT&T and Verizon’s 911 telephone database. It is important and recommended that community members provide additional phone numbers, e-mail addresses and a text number by registering through the AlertOC web portal. Each address location can have up to three phone numbers, two e-mail addresses and one text number.

Residents who have registered their cell phone numbers in the AlertOC system will receive messages on their cell phone. Since there are many instances when the public may not be at home to receive an emergency message phone call, public safety officials recommend that all residents with a cell phone add their number to the AlertOC database. A WORD... FROM CODE ENFORCEMENT

We have discovered that to have a successful and effective code enforcement program, Code Enforcement Officers must be innovative and flexible in identifying viable solutions for community concerns. One such method is sharing common concerns to eliminate violations and create neighborhoods where residents may live peacefully and safely in a quality environment.

The following are some “hot topic” issues identified by the Code Enforcement Division:

- **UNPERMITTED GARAGE SALES:** garage sales are limited to three per year per residence, and may not exceed three consecutive days. A Garage Sale Permit must be obtained prior to each sale. Garage Sale Permits are \$10 and may be obtained at City Hall.

Since the activity of posting garage sale signs on public property, utility poles and light poles is prohibited, one suggestion is to advertise your sale in a local newspaper. This way you can still reach the community while remaining in compliance with City codes.

- **TRASH BINS IN PUBLIC VIEW:** current codes require that trash containers be stored to minimize visibility from the street on days other than scheduled pick up days. Trash containers stored at the curb or in front yards areas are prohibited, and create a negative appearance in our neighborhoods.

If your trash containers are stored so that they are visible from the street, in order to avoid fines, please make arrangements to store them accordingly until your scheduled pick up day.

- **DISCARDED ITEMS:** Did you know that dumping or storage of discarded items such as equipment, household appliances, discarded furniture, and other items in any yard area is prohibited? Such activity is detrimental to the appearance of neighboring properties and largely the community. To avoid fines, if you have a large item you would like to have picked up one option is to contact Midway City Sanitary District at (714) 893-3553 to schedule removal.
- **BROWN AND/OR BARE LAWNS:** In July 2015 California was under a state of emergency based on drought conditions. As part of this state of emergency residential lawns were allowed to become brown. That state of emergency was rescinded in early 2017. Properties containing brown and distressed lawns are now enforceable. To avoid fines and penalties, please ensure your lawn areas are properly maintained with lush lawns which are free of weeds and bare dirt areas.

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team)

is a group of responsible, trained individuals that form a skilled group of Disaster Service Workers. The CERT Program can be used just for your family or in neighborhoods, businesses, and schools. The CERT members realize that in the event of a major disaster they will have to rely on themselves and their neighbors to handle emergencies until professional help arrives.



The 24 hour CERT course covers topics such as Introduction to Disaster Preparedness, First Aid, Light Search and Rescue, Fire Suppression, and Disaster Psychology. Classes are held in the Spring and the Fall.

WEST COUNTY CERT is comprised of those who live and/or work in Buena Park, Cypress, La Palma, Los Alamitos, Seal Beach, and Westminster plus their attached communities.

Every year thousands of burns and eye injuries are caused by fireworks. Following these simple safety tips can help you enjoy fireworks safely.

Recommended Safety Tips:

- Obey local laws. Safe and Sane fireworks are only legal in the cities of Anaheim, Buena Park, Costa Mesa, Fullerton, Garden Grove, Huntington Beach, Santa Ana, Stanton, Villa Park, and Westminster.
- Buy only Safe and Sane fireworks that are State Fire Marshal-approved.
- Light fireworks outdoors in a clear area and at a safe distance away from people, homes, vehicles, or flammable materials.
- Light one firework at a time and never relight a dud.
- Have a bucket of water and a hose nearby. Soak fireworks before throwing them in the trash can.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.

Fireworks and Child Safety:

- Fireworks should only be handled by adults.
- Sparklers can exceed temperatures up to 1,200° Fahrenheit, which is hot enough to melt gold.
- Never let children pick up pieces of fireworks after a show. Some may still be active.
- Parents are liable for any damage or injuries caused by their children using fireworks.

In Case of an Accident:

- Call 911 and run cool water over any burn.
- In case of an eye injury, do not rub, touch, or rinse the eye. This can cause more damage.

City-Sponsored Fourth of July Events:

- A city sponsored fireworks display is a great alternative to lighting your own fireworks.

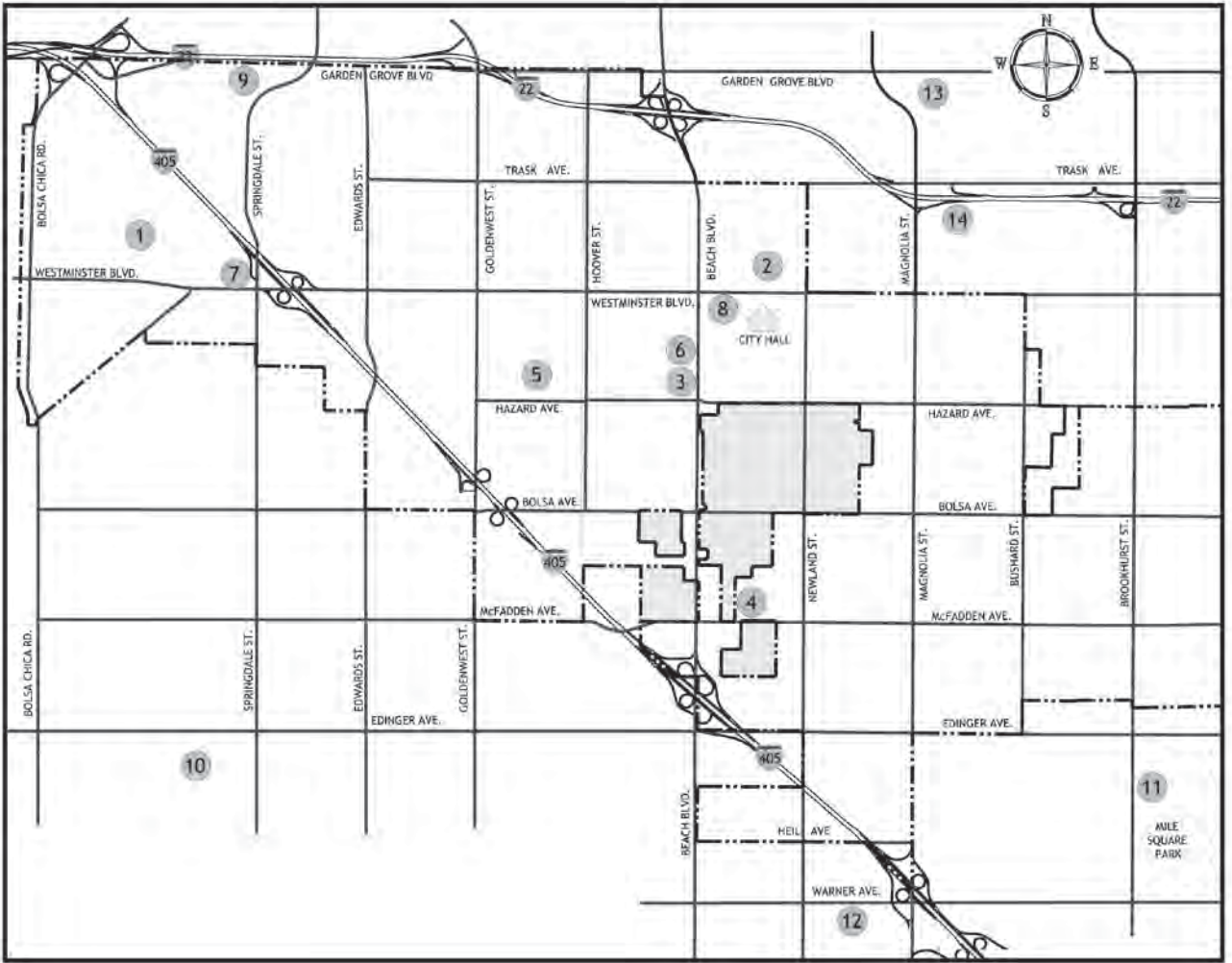
